A WEEK IN HOWELLS HOUSE (D.M.G.S. 1953-1954)

It causes me extreme pain and distress whenever I compare the present state of D.M.G.S with what I saw when I was in Howells house in 1953-1954. Howells house made a greater impression on me than Tugwell house possibly because of the people I met there. It is not easy to forget the late Mr. Samuel Erike my first dormitory leader, D.M.G.S goal keeper and Champion in the 440 and 880 yards races, the late Professor of history Dr. Fred Omu who was a Professor at the University of Lagos. He was my next dormitory leader. One cannot easily forget the indefatigable Dr. Ekanem-Ita Ekanem Umoh easily, the best all rounder during my stay in the D.M.G.S.

In 1953 Reverend P.J. Ross was the Principal and Mr. Daniel Erinne was the Vice-Principal. He was Nicknamed 'Birm' because he has a BSc in Chemistry from the University of Birmingham in England. In 1954, Rev. P.J. Ross became the Principal of St. Marks College, Nibo-Nise, a Teacher Training College. Mr. S. J. Cookey, from Okirika Grammar School became the first black Principal of D.M.G.S. Mr. D. C. Erinne became the Principal of another Teacher Training College at Irete, near Owerri. Mr. Erinne lost his life a few years later in a tragic car accident on his way to Lagos from where he would have flown to London to become the Agent-General for Eastern Nigeria in the United Kingdom.

There was no idle time in Howells house. We woke up at 5:30am for private devotion which lasted up till 6am. I do not think that most of us did any devotion. I do not know of any one that did. Most of us snatched an extra 30 minutes of sleep. At 6am, we were on our way to the playground for physical training. By 6:30am, we were on our way to the bathroom. 7am was the time for the morning prep. You dare not absent yourself or be a minute late. 8am was time for breakfast. Lateness may result in your being locked out of the dining hall. Your food may be distributed to the other students. In the dining hall, members of each house sat together. The class one students washed the plates and cleaned the tables. The class 3 students were always too eager to 'disqualify' your table if you did not clean it on time. If your table is disqualified, you have to beg one of your friends to help you carry it outside so that you can wash it. By 9am, the entire school will be in the assembly hall for morning worship. You dare not be late or absent. After the Assembly, we went to classes. Each class lasted for 40 minutes. After 7 classes, it was time for lunch. 2pm was time for lunch. 2:30pm to 3:30pm was time for afternoon sleep. After 3:30pm, it was time for games. There was always one inter- house sports or the other. There was soccer, hockey, athletics, boxing. We did not play cricket, 6pm was time for dinner. After dinner we will go to the D.M.G.S. round-about for ground-nuts. None of us had the courage to venture beyond the round-about. Some of us were almost addicted to the tasty, baked ground-nuts that those women at the round-about sold to us. We called the ground-nuts 'Mgbowa'. It was our Biology Tutor Mr. Isaac Amata that told us that 'Mgbowa' was the name of a Senegalese student who was so fond of ground-nuts that the other students gave his name to this delicacy. Most of us do not know the tune of the Mgbowa song.

We should all learn this song so that this tradition will not be lost. Mr. Solomon Obi was very popular with us. We bought iced oranges and banana from his store which was at the round-about. He operated a kerosene refrigerator. He must have made a fortune from us. He trained his son at the C.K.C.. His son became Governor of Anambra State twice!.

Night Prep. started from 7pm and lasted till 9pm for Classes 1 to 4 students and till 10pm for classes 5 and Higher School students. 9pm was lights out for the more junior students. The class 4 students told the more junior ones that they, the class 4 students were the only 'Cocks that crew'. They were the only students that spoke after lights out. 10pm was lights out for every body. If any student was found 'cockroaching' i.e reading after 10pm, that could lead to a week or two weeks suspension from school. After the lights out, the Tutors will be making their own rounds to make sure that orders were kept. On Saturday mornings, there was Inspection of the dormitories. The dormitories, the lawns, the bathrooms, the toilets, the bedding, the lockers etc were kept spotlessly clean. Aggrey house almost always won the competition for cleanliness. On Saturdays, we went to Onitsha town in school uniform for hobbies such as black-smithing, Auto-mechanic, Tailoring, Shoe-making etc. Unfortunately, most of us never took these hobbies seriously.


In Howells, we had an anthem and also a 'Motto'. The Motto was 'Through difficulties to the Stars'. We all strove to make Howells house the best in D.M.G.S. We had social evenings where each house entertained the entire school with songs and concerts. Gradually, these social evenings changed to classical plays where scenes in Julius Caesar and Coriolanus etc were acted.

On Sunday mornings by a.m., the entire school marched to the Lady's Chapel of the Anglican Cathedral for Church services. The Anglican Cathedral was a stone throw from D.M.G.S. These services were compulsory. Most of us went to these services as a routine. Our heart was not in it. We went to church to fulfill all righteousness, we were all un-saved. The Holy Spirit was not in any of us. We knew almost nothing about the Lord Jesus. We carried out the same routine for the evening services. Some us fell asleep during the sermon.

Since 1968 D.M.G.S. has been in ruins. D.M.G.S. was a battle ground from the middle of 1968 to the end of the war in January 1970. Only the old school building and a few other buildings were left but without a roof. Only a miracle will re-build D.M.G.S. I strongly believe that the Lord Jesus Christ will completely rebuild, re-equip, refashion D.M.G.S. It is His school. He is the only one that can give us this miracle.







Rev. E. D. C. Clark - Champion of DNGS By Clement C. Onyemelukwe, DMGS Old Boy, June 19, 2018

't can be said that Rev. E. D. C. Clark was the **L**principal who made DMGS what it is today. When I got into DMGS in 1946, it was already known under Rev. Clark as the school that consistently scored 100% in Cambridge School Leaving exams. At my time, students were from all parts of Eastern Nigeria, not just Igbos. Two of the senior prefects in my time were not Igbo. DMGS was also known as the best in football for secondary schools in the East, rivalled only by C. K. C. Onitsha, at the time the Roman Catholic rival to DMGS.

E. D. C. Clark was a tall imposing figure, always wearing a white shirt and short brown knicker except Sundays. He was a disciplinarian. As students we learnt discipline from hearing the punishment of wrongdoers. We always knew who the offender was; E. D. C. Clark would lock his office and cane the miscreant.

The present high influence of "teac DMGS is based primarily on sent its influence in the Anglican retur religion in the then Eastern Assis Nigeria. Rev. Clark laid the foundation for transferring the Anglican missionary Rev.

control in Eastern Nigeria to the native Igbos. Before and during Rev. Clark's time all Bishops had been English missionaries. Patterson was Bishop of most of eastern Nigeria when Rev. Clark was at DMGS. It was Clark as principal of DMGS who brought an old retiring Headmaster of the CMS Central School of Onitsha, Mr. Uzodike, a non-DMGS Old Boy, to DMGS as a "teacher." Uzodike was then UK. When he sent to returned made he was Assistant Bishop on the Niger.

Rev. Clark got DMGS

students spiritually involved principal of DMGS the whole in social work and gradually trained them to become priests, bishops and archbishops.

- Bishop Nwankiti, later Archbishop Nwankiti for Owerri Diocese
- Bishop Otubelu in the newly created Enugu Diocese
- Bishop **Jonathan** Onyemelukwe (my cousin) who replaced Bishop Uzodike as the Bishop on the Niger and was later Archbishop covering the **Anglican Dioceses in Rivers** and Cross-River
- Bishop Anikwenwa (a DMGS priest in St. Andrew's Church Onitsha under Bishop Jonathan) elevated later into a new Diocese of Awka created out of Niger to become later Archbishop Anikwenwa
- Bishop Nwosu who was junior to me in Howells House was brought up by the Rev. Clark as Bishop of the new Diocese of Asaba.

So, there was a time when due to Rev. Clark as the

Anglican system in Eastern Nigeria was controlled by DMGS bishops and archbishops.

They elevated DMGS to more than just a secondary school. That is the reason why after the civil war, the Administrator of the Eastern States, Ukpabi Asika, quickly surrendered DMGS back to the Anglicans despite his claimed take-over of secondary schools in the rebellious East.

The present Bishop on the Niger (non-DMGS) was the first non-DMGS bishop following the rule of DMGS Bishops in Eastern Nigeria. Rev. Ross was off and on the only other white missionary in our time under Rev. Clark. Contrary to a common assumption, he was not called Assistant Principal.

After I and my classmates left DMGS in 1950, we were shocked to learn that Rev. Clark was transferred from DMGS to a teacher training college in Asaba and Rev.

Ross made the DMGS principal.

It was then that missionaries decided to Nigerianize the position of DMGS principal. S. J. Cookey was brought in, a non-Igbo, who did a fantastic job in raising DMGS. Mr. Ogoazi came further down the line.

He left a legacy but nothing to rival the place of E. D. C. Clark in the history of DMGS. Neither Cookey nor Ogoazi were DMGS Old Boys.

The present Bishop on the Niger must have felt it a privilege to be the first to take over from a DMGS entrenched bishopric system.

Rumi [1207-1273] The Sufi poet: The Angel is free because of his knowledge, the beast because of his ignorance. Between the two remains the son of man to struggle.

Lives of great men all remind us


